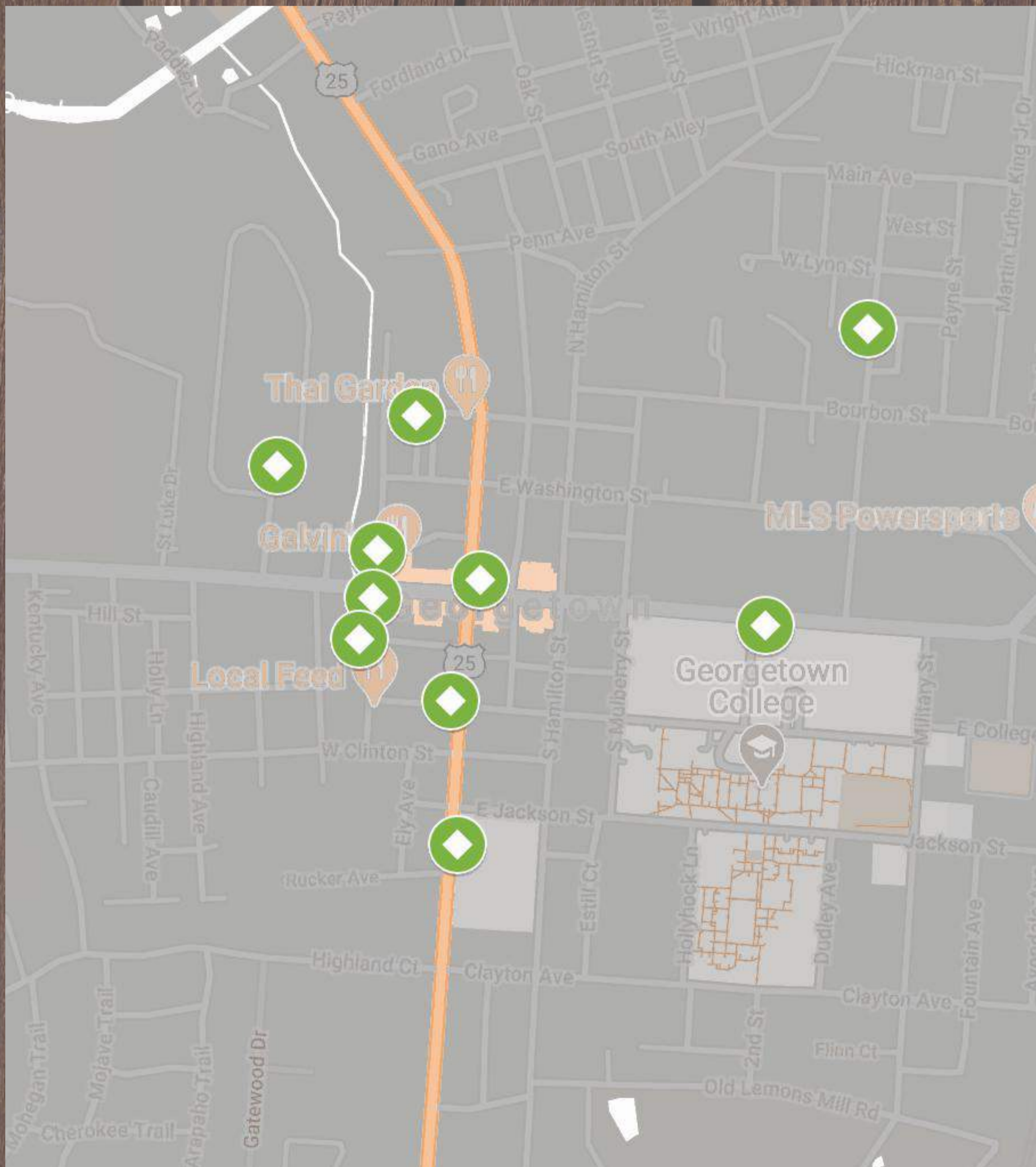


What is an Historical Marker?

A historical marker is a plaque, stone marker with engraved text or sign erected at historically significant locations, facilities, or buildings. These markers are usually near roads or in parks.

Why are they important?

They call attention to and recognize special persons, places and events in the history of the place in which they are located. They help us remember our past!
